Learning – Growing Together in Faith

From the youngest child to the most seasoned believer, we are all on a journey of faith. At Bethel, learning is not just about gaining knowledge — it's about growing as disciples of Jesus Christ.

This past year, we completed a year-long Bible study on the TV series *The Chosen*, which gave us fresh ways to see the life and ministry of Jesus. Our **regular Adult Bible Study** continues each Sunday at 8:30 a.m. before worship, providing space for honest conversation and reflection on God's Word.



For children, **Sunday School** takes place after worship for about 20–30 minutes while adults enjoy fellowship time. **Confirmation class** meets during that same window, giving students a chance to grow in faith alongside one another. This year, our confirmation students will be learning about the **Apostles' Creed, the Lutheran Confessions, the Lord's Prayer, and the Reformers of Martin Luther's time.**

As we look ahead, our learning opportunities will continue to take many shapes — Bible studies, Sunday School, confirmation, and intergenerational events — but the heart

will remain the same: to grow together in God's Word, deepen our understanding of His truth, and encourage one another in following Christ.

- Join a Bible study and bring your questions.
- Volunteer to help teach or assist in Sunday School.
- Support our confirmation students by serving as a sponsor or prayer partner.
- Try something new attend a study or class you haven't been part of before.

Serving – The Church Has Left the Building

At Bethel, service is more than something we do — it is part of who we are. We serve because Christ first served us, meeting people where they are with compassion, generosity, and love. In every act of kindness, we find joy in reflecting the heart of Jesus to our neighbors.

This past year, God blessed our Service Ministry in many ways:

- Adopt a Trail caring for local trails as good stewards of creation.
- Church garden ministry producing vegetables for local families and flowers that became beautiful bouquets delivered to brighten lives.



- Community partnerships giving money and resources to individuals and families in need, providing food, rent assistance, school supplies, and gas cards. We have partnered with the Revere School District, who regularly reach out to us when needs arise in our community.
- **Golf outing fundraiser** raising over **\$7,000** this past year to support Bethel's service ministry and its many outreach efforts.

Every one of these efforts, whether large or small, is a way of saying to our neighbors: "You are not alone. God loves you, and so do we."

- Come along for a monthly service project like Adopt a Trail or Haven of Rest.
- Lend a hand in the garden planting, watering, harvesting, or delivering.
- Help provide supplies or financial support when community needs arise.
- Support special projects like gift card drives, food pantry collections, or the annual golf outing.

Men's Group

The Men's Group at Bethel is a place for fellowship, laughter, and encouragement in faith. We gather for coffee and breakfast from **7:00–9:00 a.m.** — on warm-weather days under the church pavilion, and on colder or rainy mornings at **Ocelot Coffee**.

Our conversations are wide and lively: anything from tractors to football, from Bible characters to the surprising ways Scripture has shaped our lives. No topic is off limits, and every gathering is a chance to grow in friendship and faith.

The Men's Group also helps organize two favorite community events: the **Sweet Corn Festival** each September and the **Chili Cook-Off** in November. These gatherings not only bring our



church family together but also extend Bethel's welcome to neighbors near and far.

Come and enjoy coffee, fellowship, and laughter — and find support and love from other men in our church.

Women's Group

The Women's Group at Bethel is a community of women who gather for fellowship, study, and service, seeking to act boldly in faith and share Christ's love in practical ways. **All women of the congregation are invited to participate**. The group meets **bi-monthly**, **typically on the last Saturday of every other month (Feb, Apr, Jun, Aug, Oct)**.

This past year, the Women's Group:

- Donated 10 quilts to Lutheran World Relief.
- Hosted Bible studies on inspiring "Bible Women" such as Queen Esther, Dorcas, Miriam, and Abigail.
- Enjoyed workshops on quilting and journaling, and a special trip to the **BibleWalk Wax Museum** in Mansfield. OH.
- Helped host the Jerusalem Marketplace Rally Day in September.
- Supported ministries locally and globally, including gifts to ELCA World Hunger, Lutheran Disaster Response, WELCA SALT, and Bethel's own Service Ministry.



• Raised funds through the **Chocolate Sale** and **Lenten Fish Fry**, generating support for future ministry and outreach.

Looking ahead, the Women's Group plans to continue:

- Bi-monthly gatherings with Bible study, fellowship, and service.
- Hosting 1–2 fundraising events to support church and community projects.
- Offering social opportunities that strengthen friendships and deepen faith.
